SPECIAL CAMP REPORT 2017-18

REPORT ON NSS SPECIAL CAMP HELD AT VILLAGE SHIRUL TAH: - HINGNA, DIST: - NAGPUR.

NSS unit of Kamla Nehru College of Pharmacy, Butibori, Nagpur organized a special camp in the village, Shirul from 5th February to 11th February 2018. This special camp was organised with the help of Grampanchayat Shirul. The main object of this camp was to aware people about health and hygiene. The Volunteers of the NSS unit performed many other activities awareness programmes as literacy, tree plantation, health and hygiene etc.

DAY – 1 (5/02/2018).

The forenoon session of the Day began with a Procession by volunteers in the village. Volunteers rallied into the streets of the village to create awareness among the villagers about the ensuing special camp programme in their village for a period of one week. This was followed by an inauguration Program held at Grampanchayat hall. The programme was started with lightening the lamp and NSS song. The chief guest Mr. Abhay Gode, Sarpanch, gatgrampanchayat Shirul and other dignitaries were welcomed by NSS Programme Co-ordinator Mr. Lokesh Thote, The inaugural speech was delivered by Mr. Abhay Gode, Sarpanch, gatgrampanchayat Shirul. Dr. J. R. Baheti Principal emphasised the role of NSS in the community service. Program was conducted by Mr. Satish Meshram, several village people attended the function. Village authorities welcomed the team of Volunteers into their village and assured them all sorts of co-operation needed in making the special camp a success. During the Afternoon of the First Day Volunteers interacted with Village people. Volunteers created awareness through door to door campaign on cleanliness, importance of environment and

judicious use of Electricity, water harvesting and importance of ground water. After taking dinner volunteers discussed the project agenda and activities with NSS programme officer, before going into the bed volunteers sang the NSS song.

Day – 2 (06/02/2018).

In the dawn of the second day, volunteers organised a Shramadanam Programme. About 25 volunteers divided themselves into sub groups and went into the streets, lanes and by lanes of the village and organized a cleanliness drive. Volunteers cleaned the village roads, removed dust heaps and cleared the stagnant drainage flows and attempted to create awareness on Cleanliness and hygiene. They swept with brooms on the roads of the village.

In the following Session, a Personality Development Programme was organized. A full length discussion was initiated and Faculty Members joined in the programme. A Brain storming session was organized. Thoughts and ideas were exchanged on Leadership quality and Team Spirit and importance of collective responsibility in achieving common goals of community service.

Day – 3 (07/02/2018).

The Forenoon Session of third day began with awaering women for contributing them in economy and social well being of the community. In the evening session volunteers organised a street play on the same issue, this street play was very successful, Local People shown their interest and awareness about this issue disseminated in the community.

Day – 4 (08/02/2018).

The Subject of fourth day camp was creation of healthy society through community health services. Top most priority was given to Free Physio Treatment to underprivileged Rural People. A public announcement was made and door to door communication done by our volunteers to inform people to avail free health services. The response was excellent and about 150 village people came forward for physiotherapy. After the Lunch Break the service was continued till evening. This health check up camp was proved very successful and created a harmonious environment in the community. NSS volunteers also discussed with village people about the avoidance of open defecation. It was also felt that a sense of awareness is arsing in the community. At evening again an intensive door to door contact was done in the leadership of NSS program officer.

Day – 5 (09/02/2018).

The fifth day of the camp was full of events, It was mainly dedicated to Plantation Programme, role play on the health and cleanliness and a dance competition of youngsters. Volunteers collected about 200 saplings from nearby Nursery and brought them into the village and started planting saplings. All the volunteers formed several groups of 4-5 and were advised to plant two saplings in the gardens, courtyards and safe places of every house in the village. Encouraged the volunteers and villagers by joining the plantation program. In the afternoon an awareness program on environment was conducted. A role play was also organized by volunteers, they disseminated the message of health and hygiene. Later a dance competition was organized for young lads.

Day – 6 (10/02/2018).

The Six day began with Prarthana and Yoga. The Volunteers discussed the day plan with program officer Mr. Lokesh Thote and decided to identify those children who are not enrolled in the primary school. They have decided to make a door to door contact with the village people. They also decided to take a class in the primary school for awareness and motivation of the students on health, sanitation and environment. In the afternoon session volunteers organized volleyball Match for Adolescent and youth of the village. At evening volunteers organized a cultural programme and bone fire.

Day – 7 (11/02/2018).

The free health check up camp was organized on 7th day of camp, approximately 90 villagers came for the health check up. The camp was successfully organized under guidance of Ms. Shilpa Borkar, HOD department of Pharmacology. The day was further proceeds by valedictory function. Function was presided over by Mr. Vinod Yelne, Dr. J. R. Baheti and other staff members. Dr. J. R. Baheti addressed the gathering and explained about various service activities undertaken during the period of stay in the village and appreciated the volunteers and staff for their work and thanked the village authorities for their support. Mr. Satish Meshram, profusely thanked the volunteers and the management of the college for their various service activities and assured all sorts of co-operation in their future operations in the village. The session concluded by vote of thanks proposed by NSS Program officer Mr. Lokesh Thote .
